# WOODVILLE VILLAGE COUNCIL - REGULAR MEETING

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Woodville Village Council held on Monday, April 13, 2015 in Council Chambers, 530 Lime Street at 7:00pm. Present at Roll Call were Mayor Rich Harman, Fiscal Officer Barb Runion, Council Members-Judy Karchner, Joe Riffle, Stephanie Rizor, Jeff Tate, and Ty Tracy. Also present: Village Administrator Keith Kruse, Police Chief Roy Whitehead, Solicitor Bob Kuhlman, Deb Wallace of The Press, Karen Schepman, Zoning Inspector Bill Rowles, Sean Cairns, Michelle Dombrosky, and Tom Linke.
Council Member Denny Fetzer entered the meeting at 7:01pm.

Mayor Rich Harman called the meeting to order and led the pledge to the flag.

Minutes of the Regular Council and Finance Committee Meeting on March 23, 2015 were approved as presented.

<u>AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION-</u> Mr. Cairns stated he lives at 400 North Street and would like the village to consider vacating the village right of way next to his property. Mr. Rowles had been working with Cairns to issue a permit for a fence when the right of way problem was discovered. Mr. Kuhlman recommended the matter be sent to committee for further review.

Cairns, Dombrosky, and Rowles exited the meeting at 7:09pm.
